Course Description

This course is designed to provide first responders with the knowledge to recognize and survive a clandestine lab encounter.

This instruction will include identification and dangers of Methamphetamine, aka clandestine or “clan” labs, in homes, apartments, motel rooms, and on wheels. This course will prepare police, fire, and other first responders to the life threatening dangers of a clan lab environment. Clan labs producing Methamphetamine are on the increase in Georgia and across the U.S. This course will provide law enforcement, fire fighter personnel and other first responders with the knowledge to recognize, evaluate, react to and survive an encounter with a clandestine Lab in any setting.

- Provide an overview of clan labs, including associated trends and new developments
- Identify precursors, chemicals and common equipment transported and used in clan labs
- Identify the prevalent methods and hazards in Methamphetamine production
- Provide realistic, first responder options for stabilizing clan lab incidents

- Understand agency responsibilities as they relate to state and federal regulations

Course Objectives

- Identify the drugs that are manufactured in clandestine laboratories.
- Understand the history of methamphetamine.
- Identify the effects of methamphetamine.
- Assure compliance with state and federal regulations.
